## A People that is hated

It seems incredible that a man could hate his Land, his Country, his fellow Citizens, and even the State of which he is President; and that he hates all this so much that he is going to put the whole Country in the hands of foreigners, favoring the loss of sovereignty and independence. Yet even this has happened to the Italians, in their terrible and long history of hatred and betrayal that they suffered from their rulers, kings, emperors, popes and parliamentarians of any party. What is new in the present situation is that those in power seem to hate even themselves; they are killing themselves at the same time that they are hating and killing the Italians. The present political situation has only one meaning: everyone is busy in preparing for the next elections, and this shows that they do not realize that the italian Parliament is just a grotesque fiction. It became so because politicians keep approving the dictatorial decrees of the "technical" Monti government.

This happened once more few days ago, and we are astonished in front of the perseverance of the Pdl in condemning itself to death. One thing is certain: every time the Center-right votes in favor of the Monti government, it is losing its right to exist (not to mention that is arousing hatred within its electorate). The survival of Italy is at stake: as a State, and as a "Nation" whose sovereignty was almost completely cancelled by Europe, thanks to the Maastricht treaty, to the Euro, to mrs. Merkel and to the BCE. Given that topics like Homeland, Freedom, Identity, historical Memory, Religion and Family are considered typical of the Right (or maybe we should say "were"), it is clear that this is the real reason why the PDL now appears to be in shock and on the verge of disintegration. They keep saying that it is important to find "new faces", young people that can have enthusiasm. Needless to say that they will only be able to find new politicians that are more thirsty for power and ready to grasp it than the older ones. In today's Parliament we see people who have no respect for themselves and for any value: they are just the servants of the Bankers and of their unknown superiors.

The Left seems to be in rather better condition, simply because since its beginnings its final goal was the path towards internationalism, towards the primacy of the economic and financial management of power, towards the cancellation of the State obtained by merging it in the solidarity with people all around the world. The excess of self-confidence and at the same time the hesitation of the Left is due to the fact that they have not realized that their journey is at the end, and that they have reached their final goal. The communist President of the Italian Republic called upon Europe and waved the flag of the final victory. But the Left is not prepared to face a situation whose real meaning is not clear, even though the Left always wished it and incessantly worked to achieve it: a marxist Europe, dominated by economy, very similar to the Bolshevik Russia. Step by step, using the weapon of equality, they cancelled all differences and therefore all roles: Parent 1 and Parent 2 ... no more Father and Mother; no more Family, Religion, Property, Homeland, Nation, no more Italians. And at the end: no more Freedom. The system is more sophisticated: with the help of the Banks they can control all the movements of bank accounts, and this is an excellent substitute of the spies of Stalin; it represents a surreptitious form of "internal passport" once used in the Soviet Union. The Left, however, begins to feel the bitter taste of its victories; suddenly even its favorite "game" of Democracy, in which it was engaged for many years, is no longer needed. The goal was – even in Europe – the government of the "technicians". Lenin and his revolutionary comrades

gave themselves the name of "technicians", when they assumed power taking the place of politicians. Now, the parties must convince themselves that they lost, all of them.
